
129th Department of New York Encampment

Varmints Steal Flags


Brother Vincent Wallace (Willard Camp #154) works at Cedar Park Cemetery in Hudson, NY. One activity that he annually performs just before the 4th of July is the placement of flags for the more than 40 headstones in the Grand Army of the Republic section of the cemetery. On July 2, Brother Vincent found that over 30 of the flags had been removed; what was worse was that they weren't simply removed or stolen but completely or partially torn from their staffs and some of the shafts were broken.

The response for replacement flags was swift and somewhat overwhelming. The local Fraternal Order of Elks were the very first to respond by replacing each of the flags. The Mayor, his aide and the local police became involved and the general sentiment was disdain for vandals that would destroy and steal the National Colors from the graves of our Civil War dead. Increased patrols were promised and implemented but it was clearly noted that the Cemetery is quite large and without lighting at night, is pitch black and mischief would be difficult to detect.

No sooner were the flags replaced when the new flags were again vandalized. Police installed monitoring cameras to see if they could catch the individuals in the act of destroying or removing the flags. The perpetrators were caught in the act! The "varmints" involved were the resident woodchucks.

Video cameras revealed the woodchucks' den lined and made cozy with US flags. From the various stories and reports, it appears that the flags are treated with a chemical that attracts the woodchucks and similar events have been reported elsewhere. This story received national coverage after the Associated Press picked up the news item from the Hudson Star newspaper. Brother Wallace said that new flag holders have been ordered. These new holders will put the flags out of the reach of the woodchucks. It was a relief to all concerned that the "varmints" were not of the human variety!
