
Ebay is a wonderful place to visit and many of the Camp Brothers find their way there often. With these watchful eyes the Camp has been able to add to its collection of historic artifacts related to the Camp or the GAR in the Albany area. In recent months two photographs have been found and purchased for the archive. Unfortunately sometimes they have already been damaged by time and mishandling. That was the case of the photograph of the H.H. Howard Fife and Drum Corps Band take in Albany some time between 1896 and 1907. The photograph was dated by counting stars and looking at the star pattern on the flag on the middle right in the photograph, in this case 45 stars. It had originally been mounted on card stock and then broken in two directions as you can see in the lower photograph. With time things can be fixed. In this case Brother Robert Keough, using a computer program called PhotoShop, was able to restore the image to "almost" original condition. The top image shows enhancement in sharpness and color all accomplished using the computer.


