Bells Across New York For The G.A.R. took place at noon on April 9, 2016 in all parts of New York State. In the Albany area Department of New York Commander Ray LeMay III, Brothers of the Col. George L. Willard Camp 154 SUVCW, re-enactors from the 125th NYVI Regiment, members of the Friends of Oakwood Cemetery, cemetery staff and members of the public attended the event. The program included posting of the Colors, Pledge of Allegiance, the singing of the Battle Hymn of the Republic, invocation by the acting Camp Chaplain and The recitation of the American's Creed. This was followed by the ringing of the 3000 pound bronze Vanderheryden Memorial Bell, a Salute Volley fired by the 125th NYVI, Taps and a closing benediction. The Colors were then retired and the event ended on a very beautiful spring day at Oakwood Cemetery in Troy, NY. This was one way to keep green the memory of our Civil War ancestors.

At noon on April 9th under blue and sunny skies bells rang out at the Calvary United Methodist Church and St. Henry's Catholic Church in Long Lake, NY. Local members of the Col. George L. Willard Camp 154 of Albany, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War were on hand for the occasion. The event was to mark the 150th anniversary of the founding of the Grand Army of the Republic in April of 1866. This organization was formed by veterans of the Union Army and Navy of 1861 - 1865. The GAR, as it was known, became a very important political force in this country up to the time of World War I. The Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War was founded in 1887 to "keep green the memory" of these veterans. An interesting historical note is that Harrison Hall, shown in the figure above, is the great, great grandson of Harrison Hall who was the local guide who was charged with finding Vice President Teddy Roosevelt after President McKinley was shot in Buffalo, NY.
